- Those packages were not returned to me. Were they destroyed?
- Please provide all email and other correspondence with Senate members and with the Dean of the Veterinary Faculty confirming any discussions about the 21 July 2010 letter of complaint.
- Please provide all email and other correspondence with Senate members and with
  the Dean of the Veterinary Faculty confirming any discussions about complaints at
  any time regarding the Veterinary Faculty involvement with junk pet-food
  companies. Such communications may include but should not be limited to
  discussions regarding the current NCAT investigations.

If and whether no discussion took place in respect to each of these questions, please indicate in unambiguous terms that no discussion took place.

In keeping with NCAT summons time frames, your prompt response within five working days would be appreciated.
