We are writing to express support and agreement in the "Raw Meaty Bones" diet for pets. The health of all of our dogs, including their puppies, who we put onto the raw meaty bones diet from the age of 4 weeks old, is perfect, they have perfect teeth and gums, healthy, shiny coats, no bad breath, no flea problems and we visit the vet only once a year for our vaccinations, that is it. Our puppies are all perfectly healthy and of above average size, we have even been asked if our puppies are on steroids. We have had absolutely no health problems to report since changing our dogs' diets. Needless to say, we have saved hundreds, if not thousands of dollars on vet bills and the heartache which goes along with sick pets.

To conclude, we don't believe that there is any more proof required to show that the way our society is feeding our pets is in fact killing them.
